- 5. Build out the planned giving program with a focus on deferred gifts such as bequest expectancies, and endowment structure development.
- 6. Work in collaboration with NEOPAT's Marketing Team.
- 7. Direct the annual fund program, including mailings and annual fundraising drives.
- 8. Direct capital campaigns and other major fundraising drives.
- 9. Coordinate fund raising special events.
- 10. Direct employee fundraising drives.
- 11. Oversee prospect research.
- 12. Work closely with NEOPAT Executive Director, and Board of Directors especially as it relates to program build out and endowment strategy development.

- 14. Staff Board Development Committee meetings.
